The crucial confession

Romans 7:14-25,8:1,2

Let me put a fortune tellers hat on my head and try to peek into your soul. now I want you to be totally honest with yourself. And if I hit a nerve please don't say anything, and don't even raise an eyebrow.

- 1. You are a model of faith and virtue, and those in your family and church hold you in high esteem.
- 2. you have secret doubts about God and which He were more audible and visible.
- 3 You honestly do not feel like a "responsible adult" and sometimes feel overwhelmed by life.
- 4. You have one great fear in your life. it may be that your children will come to some accidental end. Or it may be that you will contract some great disease and die. Or it may be that you will lose your Job. And this great fear haunts you on a regular basis.
- 5. You do not feel as close to people as you would like. Lack of intimacy is a problem.
- 6. You have read the bible for years and believe it to be God's inspired word. But you feel perplexed and guilty that most of it doesn't seem to touch you where you live.
- 7. You have periodic bouts with depression that you hide from even your closest friends-- even though you claim God as the great hope.
- 8. You have one nagging skeleton in your closet that will not grant you peace. it rattles occasionally, making you feel fresh guilt over an old crime.
- you have a great secret, a secret so close so intimate that if it ever got out you know no one would ever like you again.
- 10. You have become an expert at hiding your true feelings and you frequently feel the tension from keeping up that great front>

If my predictions are anywhere near accurate

It proves one great thing

it proves even though you are a flawed human being' a flawed human being that hasn't got it all together.

The greatest confession of the New Testament is found in Matt. 16:16 Peter You are the Christ the Son of the Living God.

And we all need to make that confession in faith.

But there is another great confession that all of us need to make.

Acts 14:15

The people of Lystra wanted to call them gods and Paul and Barnabus had to confess their humanity

Men, why are you doing these things? We are also men of the same nature as you.

We are human

If the first great confession is the key in finding heaven

The second great confession is the key to finding joy.

It is important for two reasons:

- 1. it opens the door to forgiveness from God
- 2. It breaks down all the doors that are shut keeping others from loving you.

take them in order.

I. confession of humanity allows God to forgive us.

When we see ourselves as morally perfect religious piety at least on the outside we cut ourselves off from forgiveness we don't need it.

The harlot in all her sin will have more joy that the overly pious Pharisee who feels guiltless.

she has been forgiven of much she knows the joy of grace

The Pharisee only knows the tedium of the law.

Luke 7:47 He who has been forgiven little loves little.

Why do you suppose Jesus reserved his harshest words for the religious of his day?

they were sincere had a good reputation moral men

But Jesus called them a brood of vipers.

As long as they thought as themselves as righteous right with God they could not see their own sin.

As long as they thought themselves as good enough they had no need of grace.

Why would a sinless keeper-of-the-law need a Savior?

they were playing a deadly game.
Sinless and Perfect Game

any one who plays is guaranteed

- 1. a life of respectability
- 2. a life of religious piety
- 3. a life of inner misery and loneliness all you have to do is deny your guilt do all you can against pornography but deny your own lust teach against materialism but forget that you are in the same trap.

scream at the top of your lungs against spiritual apathy

but hide your own lack of commitment
condemn those who have doubts
 and go on fighting your own

focus on the rest of the world and its problems and as you do stuff your own feelings of guilt Judge others so you don't have to judge yourself.

Oh the sinless and Perfect game has it's rewards:
 distorted sort of self esteem
 your neighbors will hold you up in great regard
 The church will praise you for your holiness
Paul played the game for a while
 Romans 7

waging a war, doing that he didn't want todo

Where did it all bring him.

Rom. 8:1-2 There is now no condemnations for those who are in Christ Jesus For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death.

GRACE

played a new game sinful and forgiven.

# II. fellowship

playing the sinless and perfect game has another devastating effect

In our desire to keep our great face on we put a mighty barrier between ourselves and others.

### A great paradox:

The more "spiritual we become the less effective we seem to be to witness to those who need God's love.

who do we go in our times of disappointment who do we call of our lives become to hard to hare

Who do we call when life has give us a great punch in the eye.

do we call the D.S.

do we call super saint

we call someone who will listen and relate to our very "Human" feelings.

The church needs more cracked pots.

flawed humans

daring to be come fully Christian

and still be come fully human..... Like Christ

Why do Christians have to be so to put on such a hard

#### veneer?

the church has been producing too many carbon copies

We need to be just plain human
A saint in the sanctuary is tolerable
but a saint at the supper table is insufferable

will repel all that are around because we all have tried to play the same game and know it is a farce.
