Encouragement

Encouragement is not telling someone they have done well. That is simply a reward for something done. You may well call it honor, or accolade but it is simply something acknowledging effort spent that accomplished something. It is something expected after a job is well done. While it is a good thing, encouragement, is telling others that you believe in them before they even start. It is action before the battle. Encouragement is to help someone to make a good start.

Six ways to encourage a brother or sister in Christ

- 1. **Show you care** When you take the time to learn about others, it shows that you care. This empowers and encourages them. One of the single best ways to encourage others is to care about what they care about.
- 2. **Tell them with words** Take the time to tell your small group, your brothers in Christ, that you believe in their abilities and that you are confident that they will succeed.
- 3. **Tell them in writing** The great thing about encouraging someone in writing is that he can keep the note forever. It is the gift that keeps on giving.
- 4. **Share with others** When you are in public praise your fellow Christians. Be open with our praise and private with your criticisms.
- 5. **Trust them with greater responsibilities** When you assign responsibility to someone, even if you verbalize it, you are saying, "I trust you." Trust conveys belief. When you give someone responsibility, remember you are not only trusting them with the expectation of success, but you are allowing them to make mistakes. When you micromanage or try to "fix" things along the way, it is discouraging and demotivating. Give responsibility, trust the person, and get out of the way.
- 6. **Help them** This might sound like the opposite of #5, but let me be clear that helping is not micromanaging or meddling. Simply ask how you can help them. It's important for others to know that while you trust them, you are also there to help. This goes beyond just helping with projects or tasks, though.
