
Pattern of doing reveals the why of doing


- We give in private and God is pleased
- We pray in private and God is pleased
- We fast in private and God is pleased
- We live a frugal lifestyle and God is pleased
- We focus on the good and God is pleased
- We stop worrying and God is pleased
- We don't judge unworthily, and God is pleased

- PATTERN:
- Hypocritical act "DO NOT"
 - Displayed piety
 - Artificial nature
 - Phony
 - They have their reward
- Proper intention
 - Intent of the act
 - Righteousness is exhibited
 - Righteousness is expressed



The how to do, must be a supernatural outflow of the why.





Our aim - to please God

- So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. (2 Corinthians 5:9)
