Put these words in order of importance: 1.Oath 2. Promise 3. Your word 4.Vow 5.Swear




Matthew 5:33-37

"Again, you have heard that it was said to the people long ago, 'Do not break your oath, but fulfill to the LORD the vows you have made.' But I tell you, do not swear an oath at all: either by heaven, for it is God's throne; or by the earth, for it is his footstool; or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the Great King. And do not swear by your head, for you cannot make even one hair white or black. All you need to say is simply 'Yes' or 'No'; anything beyond this comes from the evil one.




Have you ever said?

Interpretation of the Religious Hierarchy



- Leviticus 19:12, "Do not swear falsely by My name and so profane the name of your God. I am the Lord."
- Deuteronomy 6:13, "Fear the Lord your God, serve Him only and take your oaths in His name."

The letter of the law: There was no evil in taking any oath, just as long as you did not perjure himself. And perjury was only true if you were properly sworn in.



OATHS ARE PROPER AND ARE RESTRICTED TO SOLEMN AND VITAL TIMES

What Did Jesus Illustrate? When Jesus said specifically, "SWEAR NOT AT ALL", what did was HIS intent?

Was the Intent of Jesus to put an absolute ban on oath-taking?

- 1. If Jesus was forbidding all oathtaking or contrasting two views?
- 2. In the Old Testament. God laid down rules as to how and when for oaths. Biblical accounts of Abraham, Jacob, Joseph, David.
- 3. Jesus in Matthew 26:63-64 I put you on oath by the living God that you tell us whether you are the Messiah, The Son of God? You have said so.
- Paul. Romans 9:1-2, II Corinthians 1:23, Hebrews 6:16, Galatians 1:20 Philippians 1:8
- 5. Revelation 10:6 God's heavenly angel gives an oath

Simply: Let your Yes be your Yes and Let your No be No.

- Context
 - Sermon Illustration
 - Compare and contrast
 - Greater Righteousness than the Religious of the day
- 1. Swear not at all, unless you are called upon to do so unless you have a moral obligation to do so."
- 2. When you do take an oath it is a commitment to keep.
- 3. Don't swear an oath at all to make an excuse for lying.

Roots

Language of Kingdom of Heaven Citizens

- •Our words are the conduct flowing from our character.
- Our words are to be simple, we don't need to embellish with oaths
- Exaggerated expressions lead to an untrue life
 There is no place of profane swearing



Jesus is telling us to simply live a life that is so honest, trustworthy, and dependable that people will know that when we say something we mean exactly what we say and, therefore, there will never be a need for us to have to "swear" that any statement that we make is true!

Trust is too important to risk with little white lies
