Intellectual understanding of God-

- 1 Therefore you have no excuse, every one of you who passes **judgment**, for in that which you **judge** another, you condemn **yourself**; for you who **judge** practice the same things.
- 2 And we know that the **judgment** of God rightly falls upon **those** who practice such things.
- 3 But do you suppose this, **O man**, when you pass **judgment** on those who practice such things and do the same **yourself**, that you will escape the **judgment** of God?
- 4 Or do you think lightly of the riches of His kindness and tolerance and patience, not knowing that the kindness of God leads you to repentance?
- 5 But because of **your** stubbornness and unrepentant heart **you** are storing up wrath for **yourself** in the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous **judgment** of God,

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But because of your stubbornness and unrepentant heart, you are storing up wrath for yourself on the day of wrath and revelation of the righteous judgment of God who WILL REPAY EACH PERSON ACCORDING TO HIS DEEDS: to those who by perseverance in doing good seek glory, honor, and immortality, He will give eternal life; but to those who are self-serving and do not obey the truth, but obey unrighteousness, He will give wrath and indignation. There will be tribulation and distress for every soul of mankind who does evil, for the Jew first and also for the Greek, but glory, honor, and peace to everyone who does what is good, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For there is no partiality with God.

For all who have sinned without the Law will also perish without the Law, and all who have sinned under the Law will be judged by the Law; 13 for it is not the hearers of the Law who are righteous before God, but the doers of the Law who will be justified. 14 For when Gentiles who do not have the Law instinctively perform the requirements of the Law, these, though not having Ithe Law, are a law to themselves, 15 in that they show the work of the Law written in their hearts, their conscience testifying and their thoughts alternately accusing or else defending them, ¹⁶ on the day when, according to my gospel, God will judge the secrets of mankind through Christ Jesus.

LUKE 18:11

A MORALIST POINT OF VIEW

THE MORALISTIC FALLACY


- Makes statements that move from "How things should be"
- COMPARING THESE SHOULD TO BE HOW THINGS SHOULD BE
- THE ASSUMPTION IS THAT THE WORLD IS AS IT SHOULD BE.
 - EXAMPLE: CROSSING A ONE-WAY STREET WITHOUT LOOKING BOTH WAYS UNDER THE BELIEF THAT THE WORLD WORKS THE
 WAY IT SHOULD BE.

MORAL EQUIVALENCE

- Denial of any action by comparing it to a worse action
- COMPARES ONE ACTION AS NOT SO BAD COMPARED WITH AN EXTREME
 - Example: Nazism and the holocaust was not as bad as Communism's Mao's Great Leap Forward, Stalin's
 purges and Pol Pot's killing fields.

MORAL HIGH GROUND

- BECAUSE OF STATURE, OR PLACE, OR AUTHORITY, YOUR OPINION IS ALWAYS THE BEST.
 - EXAMPLE: If I QUOTE THE A.W.TOZER OR C.S. LEWIS I MUST BE RIGHT.



MORALISTIC PREACHING

- Character analysis of someone, as an example
 - FROM THE BIBLE
 - FROM LIFE
- THEY ARE COMMENDED AS BEING GOOD
- BECOME A MOTIVE FOR CONFORMITY
- IS THIS CHRISTIANITY?

MORALISTIC THERAPEUTIC DEISM

- GOD WANTS ME TO BE HAPPY
- GOD EXISTS TO MAKE ME HAPPY.
- WHEN I AM HAPPY, I FEEL GOOD ABOUT MY LIFE.
- GOD IS FAR AWAY AND THE ONLY WAY TO FEEL GOD IS TO BE HAPPY
- There is no moral absolutes. It is all about my happiness, my joy, my comfort, my
 Position, my life, my hopes, my dreams, and my view OF the world around me.
- GOD IS A LOVING GOD AND TO MAKE ME HAPPY HE HAS NO CHOICE TO BUT LET ME INTO HEAVEN.
 - GOD IS SO GOOD HE CANNOT SEND ANYONE INTO JUDGMENT
 - Man is so good, God cannot send anyone into judgment.
- THE ONLY DEMAND IN MY LIFE IS DETERMINED BY ME.

I am a moral person as long as I am happy and that brings me closer to God.

WHAT IS YOUR RESPONSE TO SIN

- 1. ROMANS 2:3,4 BUT DO YOU SUPPOSE THIS, O MAN, WHEN YOU PASS JUDGMENT ON THOSE WHO PRACTICE SUCH THINGS AND DO THE SAME YOURSELF, THAT YOU WILL ESCAPE THE JUDGMENT OF GOD? OR DO YOU THINK LIGHTLY OF THE RICHES OF HIS KINDNESS AND TOLERANCE AND PATIENCE, NOT KNOWING THAT THE KINDNESS OF GOD LEADS YOU TO REPENTANCE?
- 2. ROMANS 2:12 ALL WHO SIN APART FROM THE LAW WILL ALSO PERISH APART FROM THE LAW, AND ALL WHO SIN UNDER THE LAW WILL BE JUDGED BY THE LAW.
- 3. ROMANS 2:14,15 FOR WHEN GENTILES WHO DO NOT HAVE THE LAW INSTINCTIVELY PERFORM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE LAW, THESE, THOUGH NOT HAVING THE LAW, ARE A LAW TO THEMSELVES, IN THAT THEY SHOW THE WORK OF THE LAW WRITTEN IN THEIR HEARTS, THEIR CONSCIENCE TESTIFYING AND THEIR THOUGHTS ALTERNATELY ACCUSING OR ELSE DEFENDING THEM,
