The Effects of Sin

Romans 6 directly addresses **SIN** in a Christian's life

Free at Last

- There is no distinction - Romans 3:22
- All have sinned - Romans 5:12
- We are connected to Adam and his death - Romans 5:18
- Jesus overcomes Adam's sinfulness - Romans 5:6-8
- Justification by works is not justification - Romans 5:1-2
 - Justification by moral compass just does not work – Latin belief
 - Justification by special ethnicity, does not count. – Jewish belief
 - Justification by special knowledge or understanding, does not count, - Greeks
- **ONLY BY FAITH IN THE ATONING DEATH AND RESURRECTION OF JESUS.**

Romans 6:1-5

The Answer to the four questions!

Romans 6:4-5

THEREFORE, WE HAVE BEEN BURIED WITH HIM THROUGH BAPTISM INTO DEATH, IN ORDER THAT AS CHRIST WAS RAISED FROM THE DEAD THROUGH THE GLORY OF THE FATHER, SO WE TOO MIGHT WALK IN NEWNESS OF LIFE. FOR IF WE HAVE BECOME UNITED WITH HIM IN THE LIKENESS OF HIS DEATH, CERTAINLY WE SHALL BE ALSO IN THE LIKENESS OF HIS RESURRECTION.
