AND THE PAGE IS TURNED.

- First 8 chapters about **individual** responsibility for a <u>cause of unity</u>.
- Now chapter 9 begins three chapters specifically about the Jews a <u>cause of a people</u>.
- It starts with Paul's great lament
 - Paul's personal responsibility and state of wretchedness in chapter 7
 - Paul as a part of corporate responsibility to God's plan Chapters 9,10,11

SECTIONS OF ROMANS 9

- 1. Paul expresses his deep sorrow and love for his fellow Jews who have rejected the gospel of Christ (Romans 9:1-5).
- 2. Paul explains that not all who are descended from Israel are true Israel, but only those who are chosen by God according to his grace and purpose (Romans 9:6-17).
- Paul defends God's right to show mercy to whom he wills and to harden whom he wills, and anticipates some objections that might arise from this doctrine (Romans 9:18-29).
- Paul concludes that the reason why many Jews did not attain righteousness is that they pursued it by works of the law instead of by faith in Christ, while many Gentiles attained it by faith (Romans 9:30-33).

ROMANS 9:1-5 NASB

9 I am telling the truth in Christ, I am not lying; my conscience testifies with me in the Holy Spirit, ² that I have great sorrow and unceasing grief in my heart. ³ For I could wish that I myself were accursed, *separated* from Christ for the sake of MY countrymen, MY kinsmen according to the flesh, ⁴ who are Israelites, to whom belongs the adoption as sons *and daughters*, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the Law, the *temple* service, and the promises; ⁵ whose are the fathers, and from whom is the Christ according to the flesh, who is over all, God blessed forever. Amen.

ADVANTAGES OF THE JEWS 9:4

- 1. God chose and called the people of Abraham to adopt them into the divine plan.
- 2. God revealed his glory to these people as long as they obeyed.
- 3. God made covenants that were exclusive to the people of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob.
- 4. God gave them a Law to set them apart from the rest of the world.
 - God provided a place of service for the nation in the grand plan for all mankind.
- 6. God worked through people (fathers) a line of responsible people unbroken
- 7. God gave them the greatest privilege of all. Providing an environment for the coming Messiah.

BUT IN THE MOST IMPORTANT PART OF THE PLAN FOR THE NATION – THEY FAILED


- God had a plan for Israel
- They were set apart for a divine purpose, a divine plan
- They were to be examples of righteousness and hope
- But they failed in the advent of the Messiah
- They were so caught up in trying to do something much less important.
 - Lifestyle became more important than faith.
 - Keep the law but lose the spirit of the law.
 - They kept the temple for God and missed God.

GOD'S PLAN CAN USE WHOMEVER HE WILLS. BUT THE PLAN IS THE THING.

- God chose Abraham over all other peoples Person for a nation – Perfect plan
- Abraham tries to work out God's plan by his own way -Person who fails – God's plan was different than the person.
- Issac over the firstborn Ishmael God's plan for mankind is through Sarah and Abraham as was promised – God's plan never thwarted by man's efforts.
- Jacob and Esau Choice by temperament God's choice of a person for the perfection of the total plan.

EXAMPLES OF GOD'S PLAN EXERCISED BY PREFERENCE TO THE PLAN AND NOT PERSONS FROM ISRAEL'S PAST

God's plan is more important than the person. The choice to put the responsibility of the plan in the person most likely to carry it to the final goal. The choice was not because of some arbitrary heavenly dice game but by the best to carry out the plan. 1. Abraham and his children – Ishmael was first born – God's plan was for the second child Issac. God made a choice of who would be best for his plan.

V 9 It is not the children by physical descent who are God's children, but it is the children of the promise who are

It's the plan man!

Moses Exodus 9:16 God still makes choices base upon the most likely to fill His plan. V 15 I will have mercy on whom I have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I have compassion

LAST QUESTIONS IN CHAPTER 9

- V 30 What then shall we say? That the Gentiles, who did not pursue righteousness, have obtained it, a righteousness that is by faith? But the people of Israel, who pursued the law as the way of righteous, have not attained it?
- Why not?.. Because they pursued it not by faith but as if it were by works.

See, I lay in Zion a stone that causes people to stumble and a rock that makes them fall, and the one who believes in Him will never be put to shame.

Being an Israelite brings no favor outside of faith Being a Gentile brings no favor outside of faith.

GOD'S PLAN INCLUDED ISRAEL

- Not on good works but by grace. A gift to one who has faith.
- God's plan through history was for Israel to be a big part of the BIG PLAN
 - The coming of the Savior of the world
 - The Messiah
 - You may call it an election or proclaimed destiny
 - But it was set as a plan and he used a nation of people, and a few specialty unique persons
 - It was a plan for all the world
 - God used circumstances, including stupid choices, sinfulness, detours, and rejection,
