In Him will the Gentiles hope."


Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Now the LORD said to Abram, "Go forth from your country, And from your relatives And from your father's house, To the land which I will show you; And I will make you a great nation, And I will bless you, And make your name great; And so you shall be a blessing; And I will bless those who bless you, And the one who curses you I will curse. - Samuels Promise of a Messiah
 - 2 Samuel 7:11-16
 - Build a house for God's name
 - Would reign forever
 - Would see it all

and have done ever since the time I appointed leaders my people Israel. I will also give you rest from all your enemies. " 'The Lord declares to you that the Lord himself will establish a house for you: 4 When your days are over and you rest with your ancestors, I will raise up your offspring to succeed you, your own flesh and blood, and I will establish his kingdom. is the one who will build a house for my Name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. 14 I will be his father, and he will be my son. When he does wrong, I will punish him with a rod wielded by men, with floggings inflicted by human hands. 45 But my love will never be taken away from him, as I took it away from Saul, whom I removed from before you. 16 Your house and your kingdom will endure forever before me[2]; your throne will be established forever."

Confirm the promises given to the fathers

- David's psalm to the world.
- Includes the Gentiles
- 1 Praise the Lord, all you nations; extol him, all you peoples.
- 2 For great is his love toward us, and the faithfulness of the Lord endures forever.

Confirm the promises given to the fathers

- Isaiah says. 11:10
 - Root of Jesse (David's father)
 - Includes the Gentiles

And in that day there shall be a root of Jesse, which shall stand for an ensign of the people; to it shall the Gentiles seek: and his rest shall be glorious.
