

POSSIBLE HEALTH IMPACTS

- More likely to develop alcohol dependence
- Three times more likely to be diagnosed
 with antisocial personality disorder
- Four times more likely to have autism
- Twice as likely to develop
 Parkinson's disease

POSSIBLE HEALTH IMPACTS

- Twice as likely to have depression
- Twice as likely to develop Alzheimer's disease (in the U.S.)
- Four times more likely to develop multiple sclerosis
- More likely to have a stroke

FEMALE BRAIN

Early face recognition Early language skills Stronger and vivid memories of emotional events The bond between hemispheres is stronger Greater interaction between sides of the brain

MALE BRAIN

Recognition of differences and changes Slower language skills Attraction to things and objects The bond between hemispheres is less Thoughts are compartmentalized to areas or locations.


Segmented vs Random

The art of Decision-making in the segmented brain

- 1. <u>Receiving</u> through the ears, eyes, and personal preferences
- 2. <u>Interpretation</u> of information and placing them in the appropriate boxes of concern
- 3. <u>Recall</u> any relevant information by looking into the well-sorted boxes of information. All that I know is indexed to specific areas.
- 4. <u>Evaluation</u> and judgment of previous steps. What difference does all the information make to me?
- 5. <u>Response</u> to the evaluation of all available information

James 1:9 is speaking to a segmented brain person.

- Quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to anger
- Decision making in the male brain
 - Receiving
 - Interpretation
 - Recall
 - Evaluation
 - Response

 If you live only on a statement of faith and do no work your heart has already stopped. Your faith is in a statement of faith, and it is dead.
